How the times have changed! We'll do our best to engage with Synod activities locally, at deanery level and diocesan level. We shall be reminded of that Vatican II expression "the Church in the World..." and it's not referring to the buildings. They will perish one day but the People we call the People of God will hopefully outlive any buildings. Let's pray for the Synod.

Samuel has given us a flavour of preparations for the COP26 31st, Feast of All Saints meeting that takes place next month. Thank you, Samuel: our petition to Sarah Dines has been acknowledged and she thanks our Conference (COP26) parish community for contacting her about our COP26 concerns. If

Samuel's Report...

Pope Francis continues to draw our attention to our responsibilities as custodians of the planet, and last week the Vatican hosted a meeting of religious leaders and scientists, who together issued an appeal to the COP26 President-Designate, the Rt Hon Alok Sharma, and the Italian Minister for Foreign Affairs. The meeting included representatives from various Christian denominations, both Sunni and Shi'a Islam, Judaism, Hinduism, Sikhism, Buddhism, Confucianism, Taoism, Zoroastrianism and Jainism.

The appeal presses wealthier nations, and those most responsible, to take the lead in climate action at home, and to provide help to those vulnerable countries and those needing funding for the required changes. The appeal also speaks of the responsibility of religious leaders to bring about a change of heart in their congregations, by striving to "remind our communities that care for the earth and for others is a key tenet of all our traditions". They also aim to provide better ecological and scientific education through the institutions they are responsible for. The appeal calls religious communities to "embrace simple and sustainable lifestyles at home, so as to reduce our collective carbon remember also all those who care footprint", "to make bold plans to achieve full sustainability in our buildings, land, vehicles and other properties", for the sick and elderly in hospital, and "align our financial investments with environmentally and socially responsible standards".

Unfortunately, it is understood that Pope Francis will not attend COP26 as he is recovering from deceased parishioners, relatives and surgery and is instead sending Cardinal Parolin, the Vatican's secretary of state, to represent the Church there.
